About Nga, Laos



High in the mountains of Southeast Asia sits Nga, a community of 4,500 people living in the remote and rural landscape of Northern Laos. While skilled at getting the most out of their natural resources, families in Nga face tremendous challenges. They lack access to basic – yet crucial – social supports, and struggle to build a better life for their children.

About Nga, Laos



- In Nga, the effects of poverty, language barriers, and inadequate school facilities mean that 29% of children drop out of school before finishing the first grade.
- A large number of children in Nga spend less than one year in school in their entire lifetime. Without education, their opportunities for the future are severely limited.

EDUCATION

- Constructing six new preschools to help children grow, develop, and learn.
- Establishing pre-primary school accelerated learning programs to help children catch up and transition into primary school.
- Providing teacher training on how to create a nurturing, gender-sensitive learning environment for children, continued education.
- Leading Lao language transition classes to help non-Lao speaking children improve their comprehension before entering primary school.
